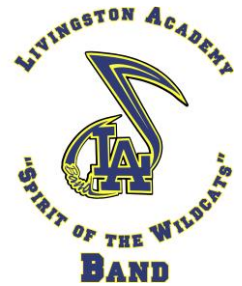

Characteristic/ Traits of a Band person

Determination: Is a positive emotional feeling that involves persevering towards a difficult goal in spite of obstacles. **Determination** occurs prior to goal attainment and serves to motivate behavior that will help achieve one's goal.

Honor: *Noun:* high respect; great esteem. adherence to what is right or to a conventional standard of conduct. *Verb:* regard with great respect. fulfill (an obligation) or keep (an agreement).

Fortitude: courage in pain or adversity.

Integrity: the quality of being honest and having strong moral principles; moral uprightness. the state of being whole and undivided.

Commitment: the state or quality of being dedicated to a cause, activity, etc. an engagement or obligation that restricts freedom of action.

Purpose: *Noun:* the reason for which something is done or created or for which something exists. *Verb:* have as one's intention or objective.

Tenacity: the quality or fact of being able to grip something firmly; grip; the quality or fact of being very determined; determination.

Confidence: the feeling or belief that one can rely on someone or something; firm trust. the state of feeling certain about the truth of something. a feeling of self-assurance arising from one's appreciation of one's own abilities or qualities.

Decisiveness: the ability to make decisions quickly and effectively. the conclusive nature of an issue that has been settled or a result that has been produced.

Accountability: the fact or condition of being accountable; responsibility.

Courage: the ability to do something that frightens one. strength in the face of pain or grief.

Initiative: An **initiative** is the start of something, with the hope that it will continue. Government and business start initiatives all the time. You can also talk about **initiative** as a personal quality. A person with **initiative** is motivated to do things. If you take the **initiative**, you're willing to get things done on your own.

Discipline: Discipline is action or inaction that is regulated to be in accordance with a particular system of governance. Discipline is commonly applied to regulating human and animal behavior to its society or environment it belongs.

Self-discipline: the ability to control one's feelings and overcome one's weaknesses; the ability to pursue what one thinks is right despite temptations to abandon it.

Dedication: a feeling of very strong support for or loyalty to someone or something : the quality or state of being dedicated to a person, group, cause, etc. : a message at the beginning of a book, song, etc., saying that it was written or is being performed in order to honor or express affection for someone.

Excellence: the quality of being excellent. an excellent or valuable quality : virtue. the quality of being outstanding or extremely good.

Supportive: providing encouragement or emotional help.

Encourager: To inspire with hope, courage, or confidence. · To give support to; foster:

Punctual: happening or doing something at the agreed or proper time; on time.

Musician: a person who plays a musical instrument, especially as a profession, or is musically talented.

Member: One who officially belongs to a group. · A part of a whole.

Selfless: concerned more with the needs and wishes of others than with one's own; unselfish.

No one trait is greater than another, together they open your world to greater possibilities.

Possibilities: a chance that something might exist, happen, or be true; the state or fact of being possible; something that might be done or might happen; something that is possible.

Patience: the capacity to accept or tolerate delay, trouble, or suffering without getting angry or upset.

Accepting: able or willing to accept something or someone : inclined to regard something or someone with acceptance rather than with hostility or fear

Family: as determined by like interest and participation, by the roles we sometimes place each other in, as "Kool and the Gang" sang "We Are Family".

Exceptional: unusually good; outstanding.

Fantastic: extraordinarily good or attractive. extremely good

Superb: excellent. impressively splendid marked to the highest degree by grandeur, excellence, brilliance, or competence

Character: the group of qualities that make a person, group, or thing different from others

Camaraderie: mutual trust and friendship among people who spend a lot of time together.

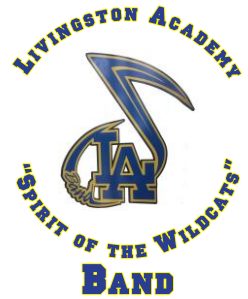

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Student Leadership Application Process - 2022

Drum Major Interview and Audition Information

Band Captain / Lieutenants Interview Information

Deadlines and Dates:

The essay and all other required material must be turned in by **Friday, May 6th, 2022** by 3:00 PM. The interview will be held on TBD, in person. The conducting audition will be held on the same day and time of interview. (We Will Rock You & National Anthem). (Drum Major candidates only)

Qualifications:

The position of **Drum Major** of the Livingston Academy Band is open to all upcoming *third* and *fourth* year band members. The position of **Band Captain (Band only) / Lieutenants (includes Color Guard)** of the Livingston Academy Band is open to all upcoming *second*, *third*, and *fourth* year band members. Because these positions require a higher level of musical knowledge and understanding (musicianship)(guard work) , it is not typical for younger or less experienced band members to audition or for an auxiliary member to audition (Drum Major Only). Leadership experience in either the band or another organization is highly recommended. Candidates must meet and maintain Overton County School's standards for academic eligibility in extracurricular activities.

Requirements:

Auditions for the position of Drum Major will consist of three phases other Officers, the first two phases:

1. All candidates must complete and write an essay explaining his/her reasons for wanting to become Drum Major or other Band Officer. This essay should reflect the candidate's leadership skills, his/her definition of a true leader, the goals he/she will set, and why he/she is best suited for this job. The essay must be typed and should conform to the rules of basic grammar and composition.
2. The second phase will consist of an interview with the director(s). The candidate's qualifications will be reviewed at this time and various questions typical of a job interview will be asked. It is expected candidates will dress and groom themselves appropriately for this phase.
3. The final phase will be the actual conducting audition in front of the band. All candidates will be given a 3-minute practice session with the band prior to the audition. Candidates will be required to conduct the National Anthem and an assigned piece from the band's repertoire (listed above).

Guidelines and Other Information:

1. It is very important to understand that this audition process will not be decided based solely on conducting (DM). This process should be treated like a job interview and not a competition where the person with the highest score wins. The finalist(s) will be selected based on the information in the essay, interview, and audition, an unbiased decision will be used when selecting the drum major (s), Band Captain and Lieutenants.

2. There are no "assistant" positions – If more than one Drum Major is chosen they will share the responsibilities equally as partners. In the event that the new drum major (s) cannot fulfill their duties, the Band Director will select any replacements or successors. Band Captain is 2nd in line to the Drum Major with Lieutenants being 3rd in line and are chosen based mainly on leadership skills and maturity. In the event that the new Band Captain or Lieutenants cannot fulfill their duties, the Band Director will select any replacements or successors. Because it is possible there may only be one finalist, everyone needs to prepare him or herself for the possibility of not being selected. This is not meant to sound cruel – it is simply the truth.

3. Drum Major Candidates -It is important to understand that you are auditioning for the top student leadership position in the band. Band Captain/ Lieutenants - It is important to understand that you are interviewing for the next to the top student leadership position in the band. These are not position's to be taken lightly; we pride ourselves on the tradition and spirit that this band represents. You must be prepared to make this job your FIRST priority. The Drum Major (s) and Band Captain/ Lieutenants cannot miss rehearsals or performances, nor can they adopt sloppy etiquette and poor attitudes. All appointments, meetings, and athletic events must be scheduled around band activities. If you do not think you can handle this, then drop out of the application process now!

4. It is important to realize that conducting is only a small portion of the Drum Majors' duties. In fact, all student leadership jobs consist of about 90% leadership and 10% conducting or work. Do not audition/interview just because you want to wear a flashier outfit and conduct the band and or boss them around! This is a very small portion of the job. Your Audition will be graded on a scale including 60 points academics/interview/essay, and 40 points conducting (Drum Major only).

5. All deadlines and audition dates have been set. There will be NO make-up dates or deadline extensions. You must work around other conflicts to be at these functions. Plan accordingly.

6. If you do not feel that this selection process is fair, or if you do not feel that the Band Director can make an honest, justifiable decision on the finalists, please do not audition for this position.

2022 - 2023 Color Guard

What is color guard?

Color Guard is a musical athletic activity that requires hand and eye coordination, stamina, and dedication. The color guard performs alongside the marching band providing a visual production to the Band's show. It is a VERY active activity that requires everyone who participates to run, exercise, and push their personal fitness limits. Push-ups, running, and other exercises will be used for conditioning and strength building. One of the most interesting parts about watching a marching band is the color guard! The color guard has the unique responsibility to interpret the music through visual effects. Due to the relationship between color guard and military drills, you have to practice to become a member. In color guard we emphasize training in the student's ability to spin, dance, and perform. It is very much a group activity, so learning to perform together is the ultimate goal!

What is required of a color guard member?

Color guard members are required to be at all rehearsals that the band holds and may be required to do extra rehearsals during competition season! Members are also required to attend all games and competitions with the band. Members will be **required** to be at all camps during the summer:

A Band fee is necessary as a part of what we do, we are not fee waived.

Audition and practices are tentatively scheduled for the 3rd week of April.

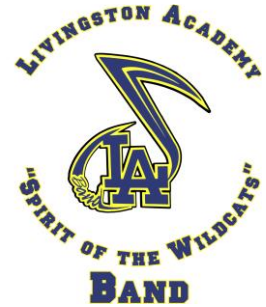

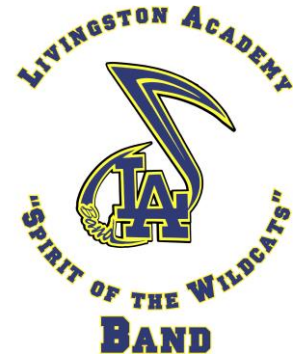

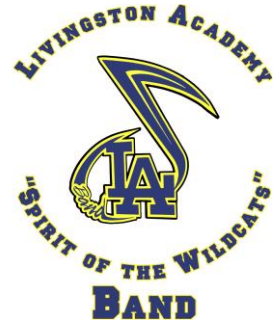

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Parents and Students,

We have and will be checking out uniforms to each student and there are a few guidelines we would like the parents and students to know about.

1. **Uniforms are Dry-Clean only.**

We have included this in the band fees, the cost to get the uniforms dry-cleaned and ready for use. Mr. Dingwall or another parent will take the uniforms to be cleaned as needed. The fee is \$40 per year for up to 5 cleanings.

2. **Alter to Fit**

We have a few weeks to alter/hem any items that need to be. **DO NOT CUT** the material. It can be folded under and hemmed then pressed to crease. But, we must be able to use that uniform in the future. Sleeves and Pants both should be checked. Pants should be hemmed to where they drape right "to" the shoe but **not** bundled up on top of it. A straight pant leg is the style desired.

Altering needs to be done and **the uniform returned to the Band Room as soon as possible or by Aug. 18th, 2021.** that way we can have them ready by first game which is usually on the third Friday of August! With each uniform costing about \$450 apiece, replacements costing even higher we must maintain them. Call/Email Mr. Dingwall with any questions.

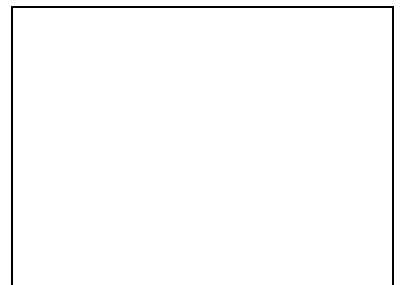
